She liked to joke that when she retired, they needed two people to replace her!

Mary's interests were wide-ranging. She loved to travel, and was a devoted reader with an extensive book collection. As a lifelong learner, she enjoyed taking self-improvement courses. Her creativity found expression in many forms—from her work as a master seamstress to her piano playing and her enthusiasm for Scottish country dancing. Through these passions she formed many lasting friendships, especially with Elspeth, Margaret, Diane, and Dierdre.

When independent living became more challenging, Liz and Monique supported Mary in helping her to move from her beloved Kitsilano apartment to Amica Arbutus and later to South Granville Park Lodge. These transitions brought new energy and companionship into her life, and she embraced the activities and friendships she found in each community.

Mary is survived by her niece Yasmin, and her nephew Michael, both of whom live in England.
