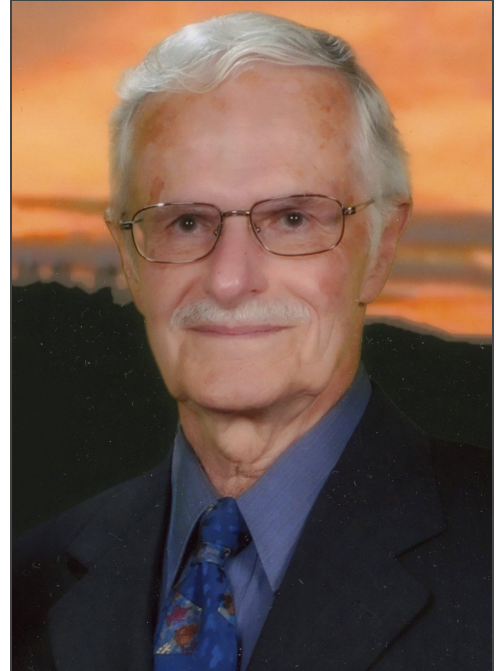
August 18, 1937-January 9, 2023

It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Lorne William McConnell at Burnaby General Hospital at the age of 85 years.

Lorne was born in Chilliwack on August 18, 1937, to Walter and Muriel McConnell (nee Hambrook). During his school years the family lived in Armstrong and Lorne was very active in sports and 4H. He was very proud of his 1st place stock judging medal won in 1955. Lorne graduated from high school in 1957. He joined the Air force August 13, 1958, as a Radar Technician and was honourably released August 12, 1963. He completed a Diploma in Electronic Engineering Technology in 1965. Lorne landed a job with BC Tel (Telus) in November 1965 where he worked for 31 years until his retirement in 1996.

Lorne met Joyce Scambler at a party in 1974. Over the next 47 years they spent many happy hours together golfing, curling and on cruises with their group of dear friends. Lorne was an avid golfer and he attended "The Rustic Open" for the entire 26 years since it started without missing a single year!
