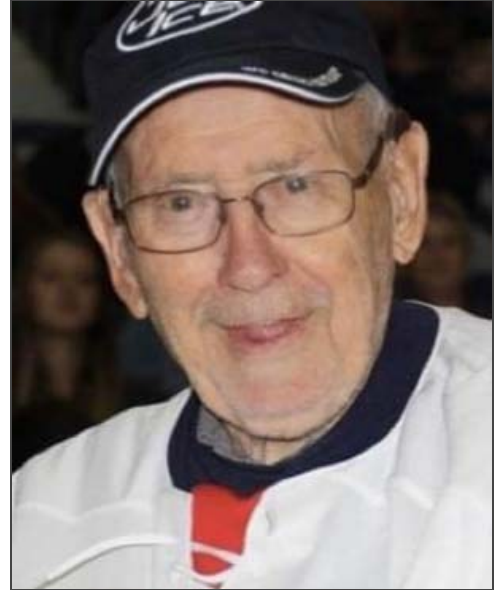


# Clarence Keith McCutcheon
