

Brian L. McGill

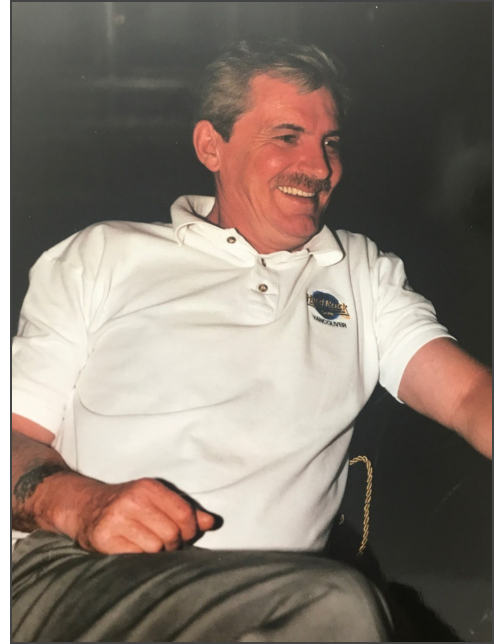
