staff at Didsbury Hospital; Dr. Monzon and staff at Tom Baker Cancer Clinic; Dr.

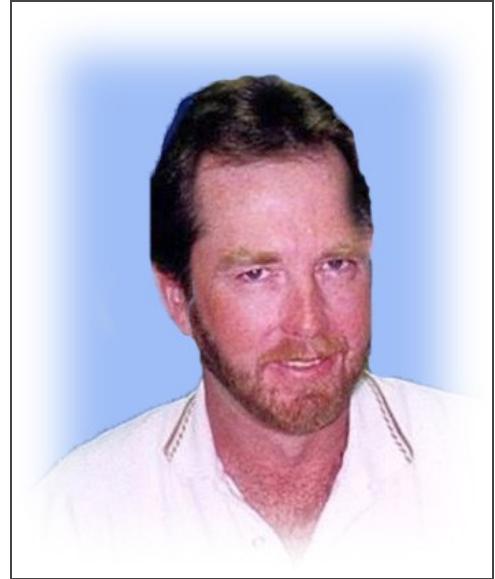
Mitta and staff at Foothills Hospital; and the fantastic Palliative Care staff at
