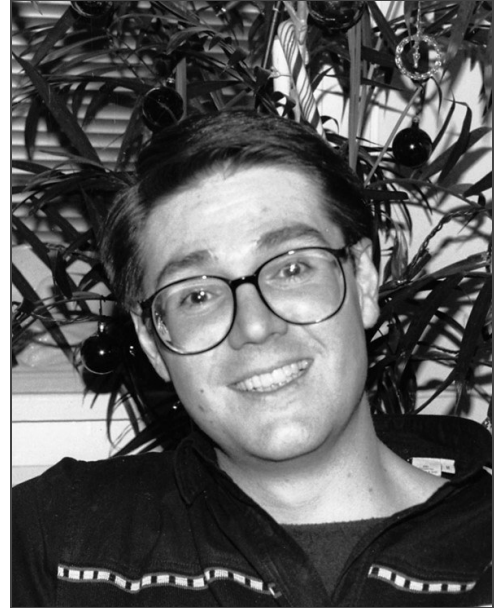


Scott Edward McMullan
