During his own 41 years of recovery, he opened his heart to hundreds of people whom he had sponsored while on their own path to recovery. Ross began working at the very young age of 12 selling Cotton Candy at the Calgary Stampede and travelled the fair circuit. Ross was also self-employed for many years, from making home computer cabinets to manufacturing equipment for the Pipe Lines.

In 1989 Ross found his true passion, a career in Real Estate. He became a well-known Realtor in Calgary and continued with this career until his COPD took over his daily life in 2016.
