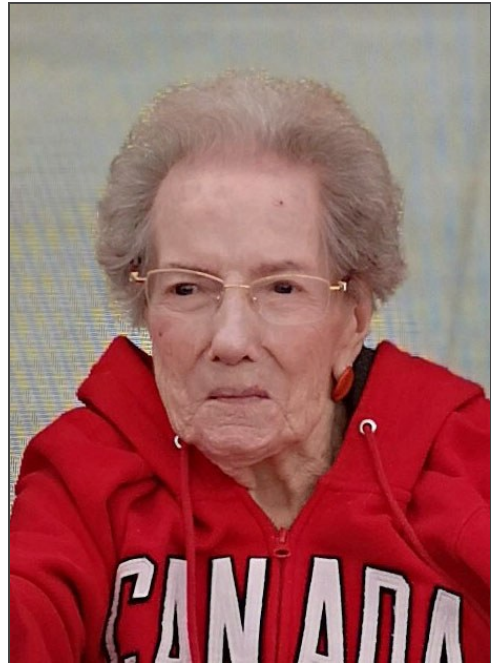


Theresa Rose Miller
