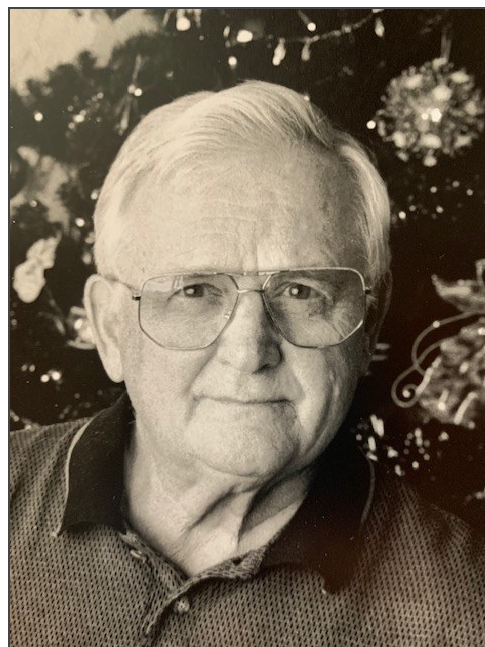


Joseph (Joe) Most
