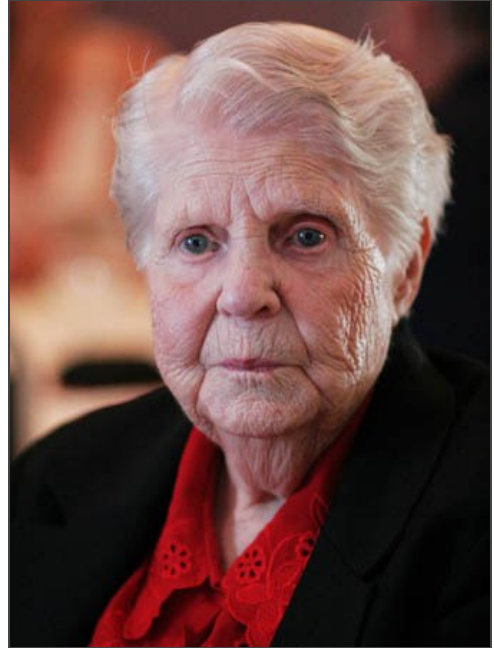


# Janet Mae Nagy
