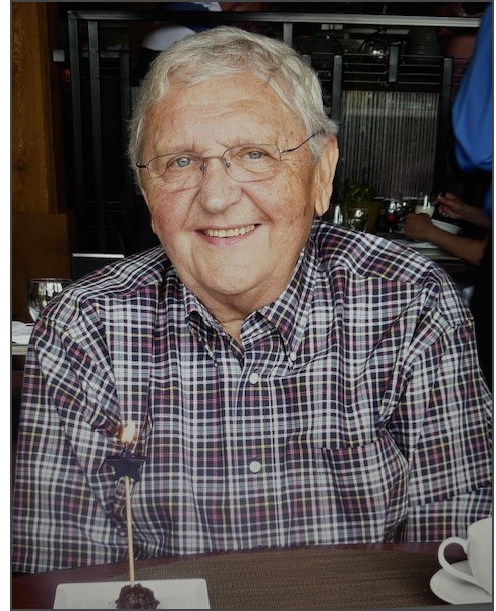


# Lawrence Julius Pasemko
