

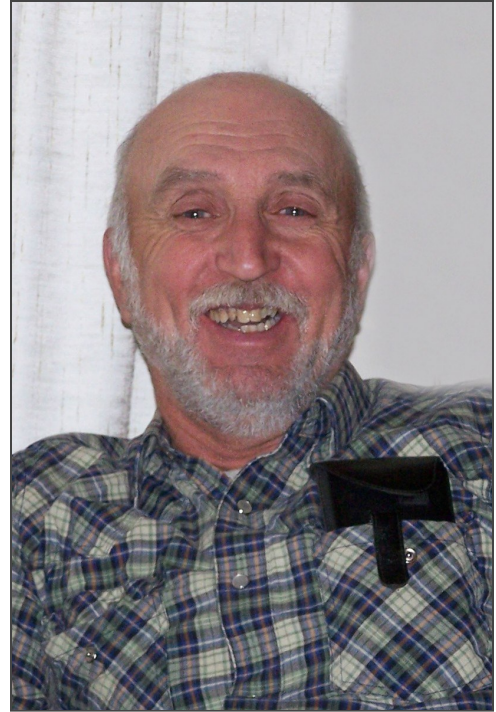
# Gary Eugene Piper
