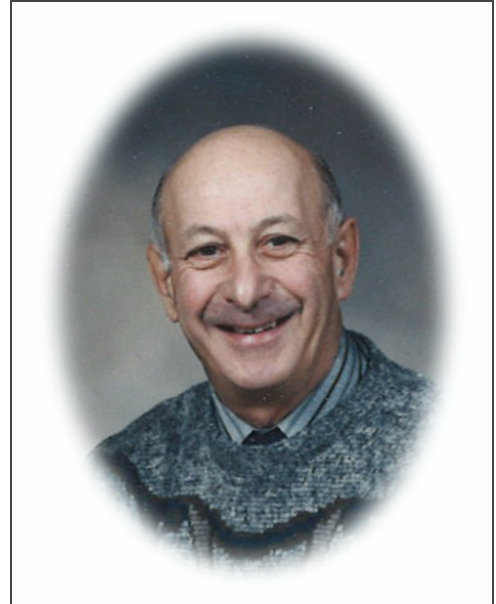


O'Ray Charles Pontius
