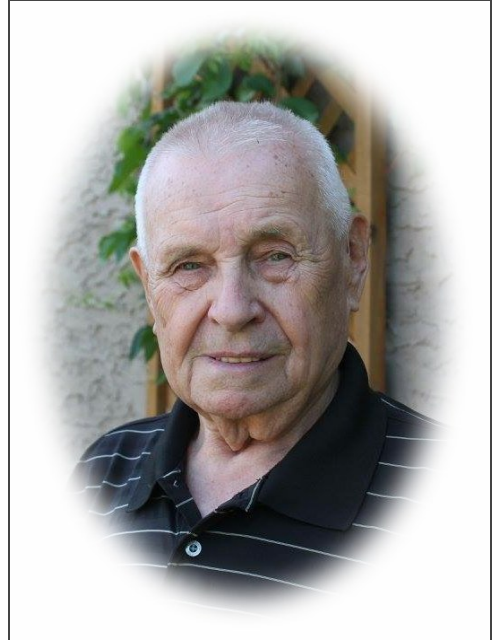


Stanley Nick Procyk

We are deeply saddened by the loss of our Husband, Father, Grandpa and Great-Grandpa Stanley Nick Procyk who passed away on October 21, 2018 at the Regina Grace Hospice after an almost 2-year battle with pancreatic cancer.

In 1963 Stanley co-owned a gas station on the corner of Dewdney Avenue and Winnipeg Street and in 1964 Stanley took a job at CIP paper company where he worked for nearly 25 years as a machine operator. He retired at the age of 53 and enjoyed his time working in his wood shop, fishing and golfing, and spending time at the cabin at Alice Beach. He and Annette were also avid Regina Pats fans, holding season tickets for close to 25 years.

Stanley's greatest passion was his grandchildren and his great-grandchildren. He was their number one fan and enjoyed cheering them on playing hockey, baseball, soccer, track and field events, and attending dance and piano recitals.

He always loved to share humorous, witty life stories and could keep a room highly entertained. He will be truly missed by all who knew him.
