

Latrell Marcus Chanze Redwood

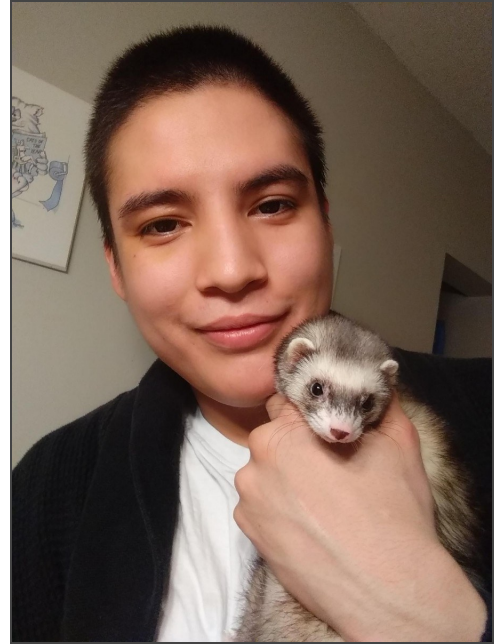
