

James Alexander Robbins

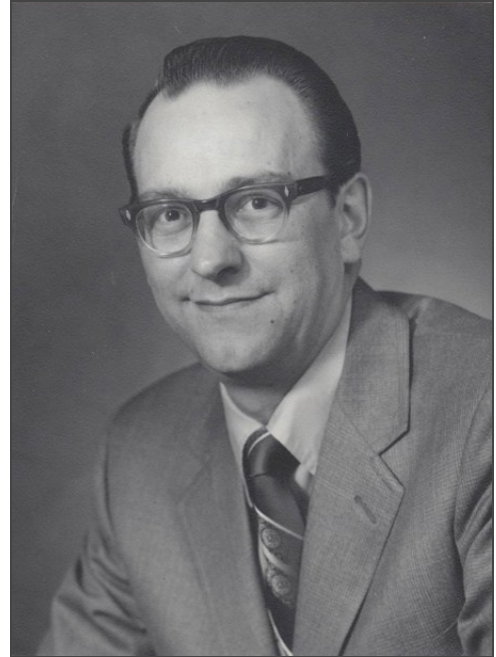
