the privilege to know him. He is survived by his Sisters: Dolores and Patsy

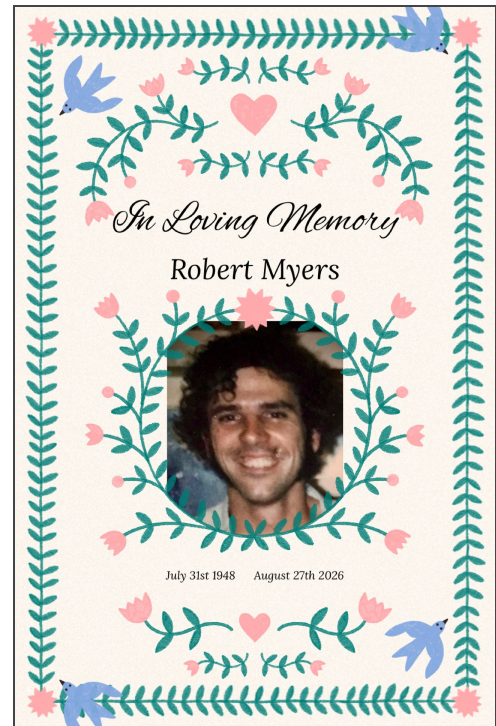
(Patricia), Daughter Peura and Grandson Vinski.(Finland) Nieces: Jamie, Irene,
