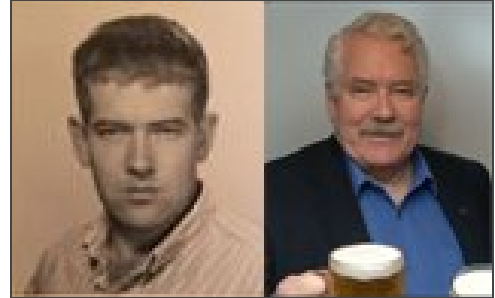


Beverly Ellis Robertson
