

# Ross Roenspiess

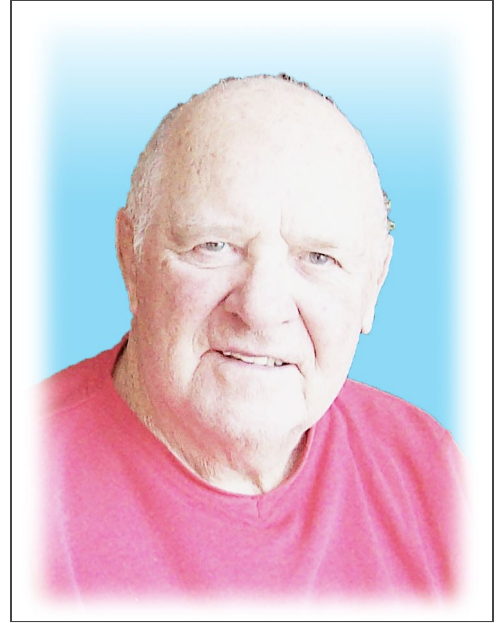
