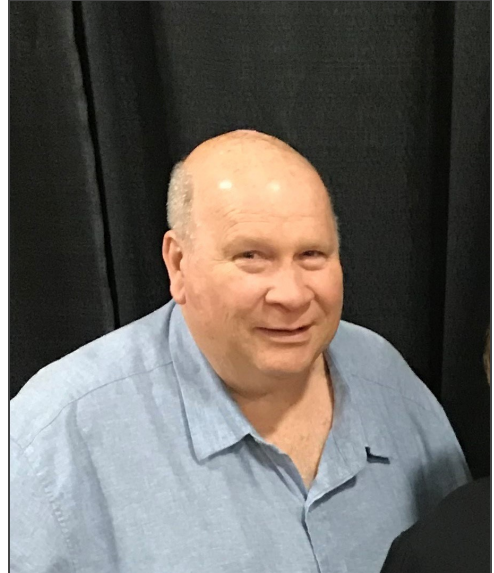


# Cliff Rozander
