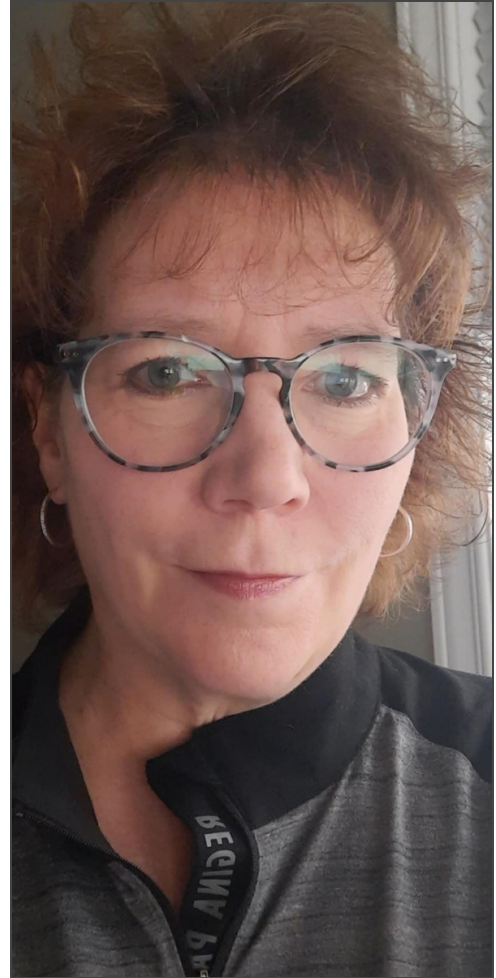


Erin Lynn Sabko
