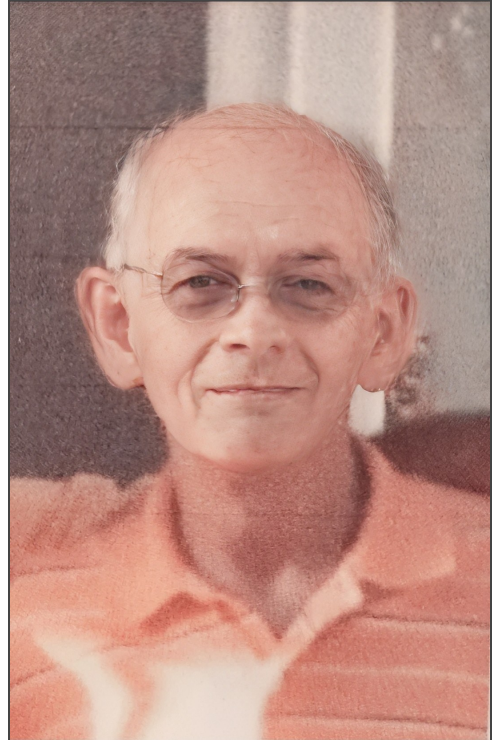


# Kenneth John Schmidt
