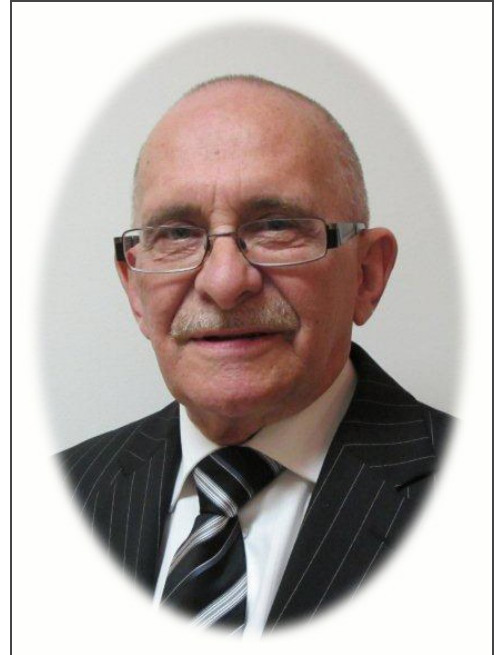


Lawrence "Monty" Sharber
