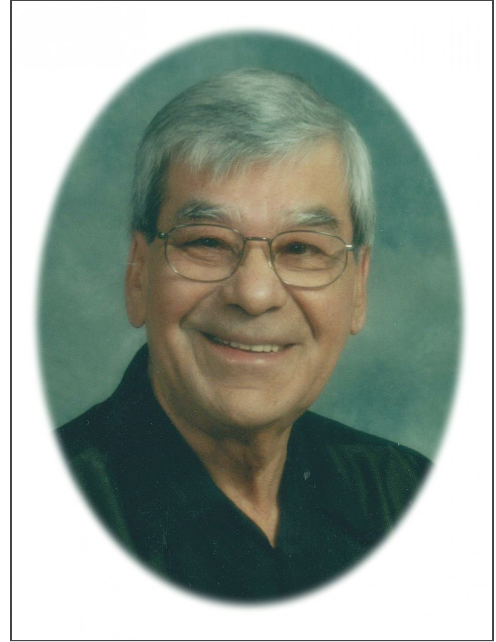


Wilbert Ronald Eli Sinclair
