Philip Singer (Phil) passed away peacefully on January 23, 2024, after a long battle with cancer at the age of 84.

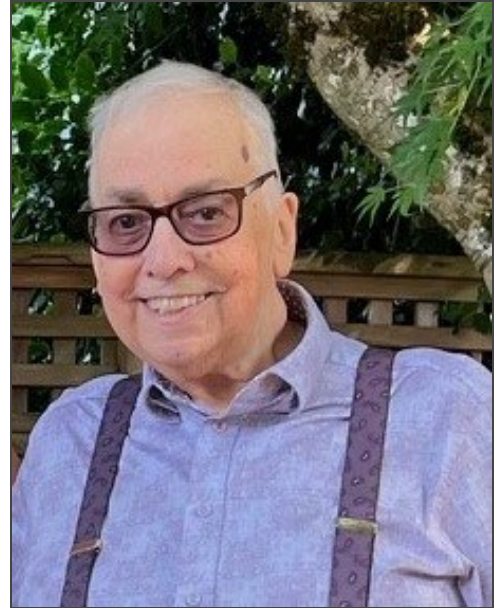
