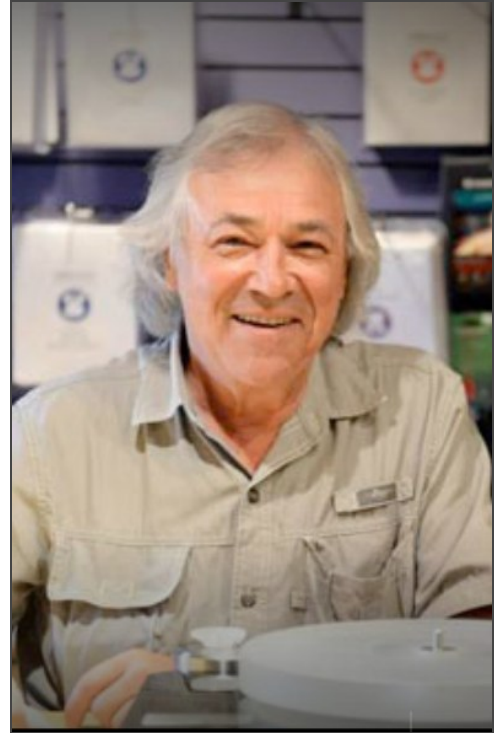


# "Harry" Vern Sotropa
