Henry Joseph Soucy, passed into the arms of his Savior with his family by his side on Tuesday, April 19, 2022, at the age of 90 years.

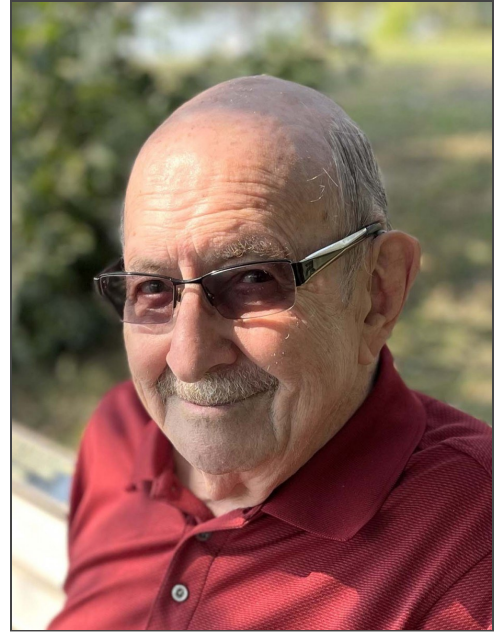
