Mrs. Tillie Stack of Calgary, beloved wife of the late Fred Stack, passed away on Saturday, February 16, 2013 at the age of 92 years, after a courageous battle with cancer. Tillie started working for Calgary Co-op in 1965 until her Retirement 25 years later. She loved all the friends she made at Co-op and was still meeting the girls for "Lunch" many years later. Tillie loved camping with family and friends, bowling, playing cards and meeting friends for lunch and a good gab session. She also liked to be involved in organizing card tournaments or volunteering to deliver

Meals on wheels, which she enjoyed for many years.

To all the Staff at Meals on Wheels and the delivery people who would deliver her meals last so that they could come in and visit for a few minutes.
