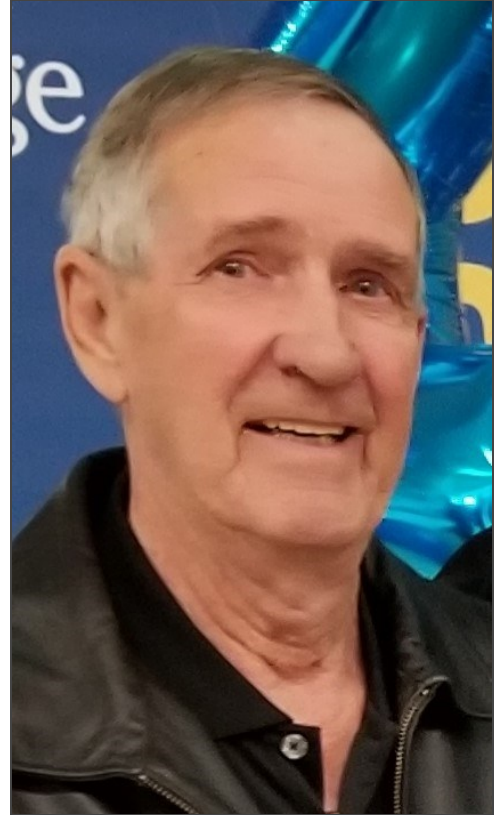
Best friends of 50 yrs Gary and Rickea Sherstobitoff and family.
