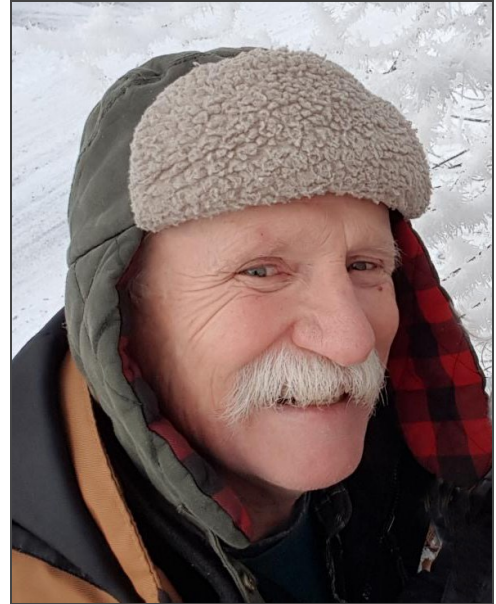


David Wayne Strachan

With a sad heart, we announce the passing of David Wayne Strachan. On November 29, 2019 David left this world with his family at his side after a brave battle with a rare autoimmune disease called Dermatomyositis.



Born on October 4, 1955 David was a committed and loyal husband and father. He lived life as a passionate man. He was generous, hardworking and resourceful; always keen to build the dreamed up creations of his wife and daughter and had a playful attitude toward life. David's laugh, kind eyes, and notorious mustache will be remembered by those who loved him. David held a unique sense of style that included wearing socks with sandals and his many hats.

David worked as a welder for the majority of his life, a profession he perfected over the 30 plus years of his career.
