In 1988, he met his current wife, Cathy, married in Calgary in 1990 then they went back to Chicago until his retirement.

Jim immigrated to Canada after which, he and Cathy set up residence in Airdrie. In retirement they traveled extensively until becoming snow birds in Arizona in 2014.

Arizona wasn't for Cathy so they sold in 2017 and Jim became involved with Airdrie Iron Horse Park where he volunteered until his passing.
