With great sadness, we announce the passing of Tanner Weed on March 5th, 2026.

Tanner was born on November 15th, 1995, in Regina SK to his parents Lorne and Joanne

Weed. He was the eldest of three children. From a young age, Tanner was known for his unique sense of humour and creativity, always quick with a joke.

He attended school in Regina until Grade 3, before moving to Balgonie in the summer of 2004, where he completed his elementary and high school education at Balgonie Elementary School and Greenall High School. Following high school graduation, Tanner settled into his apartment in Regina, and worked at Vaping the Way for many years. He was respected and valued by his boss and colleagues as a reliable, punctual and loyal employee.

Outside of work, Tanner had a strong passion for history, politics, and science fiction. Music was always a significant part of his life, whether that be listening to and sharing songs with friends, or singing on stage with a band before a live audience. He enjoyed a wide range of genres, although heavy metal was always his favourite. Alongside music, Tanner loved playing Dungeons & Dragons, online gaming and all things Star Wars. He especially loved military history, often collecting artifacts and memorabilia. Tanner was an exceptional writer and poet, described by friends and family as a true “wordsmith”. His ability to put thoughts and feelings onto paper was a gift that will be forever cherished.



Tanner deeply valued time spent with his family and close friends, especially sharing stories around a fire or spending days together at the lake. Those who knew him will remember his contagious laugh, entertaining impressions, and unfiltered comments. Despite the challenges he faced, Tanner navigated life with grace, kindness, and generosity.
