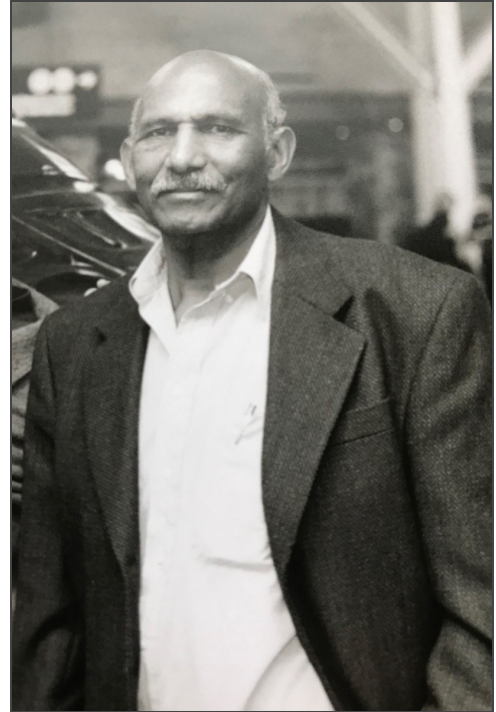


# Navis Michael Thomas
