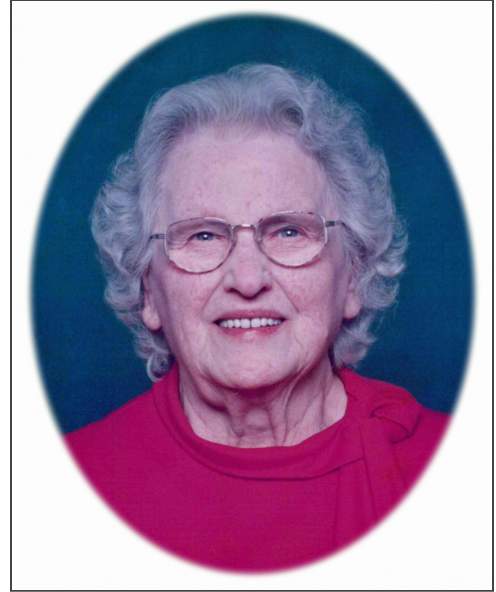


# Edith Magdalena Tourney
