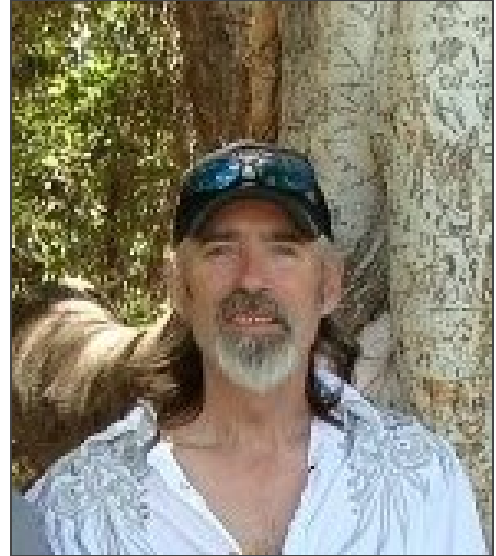


# David Ulley
