

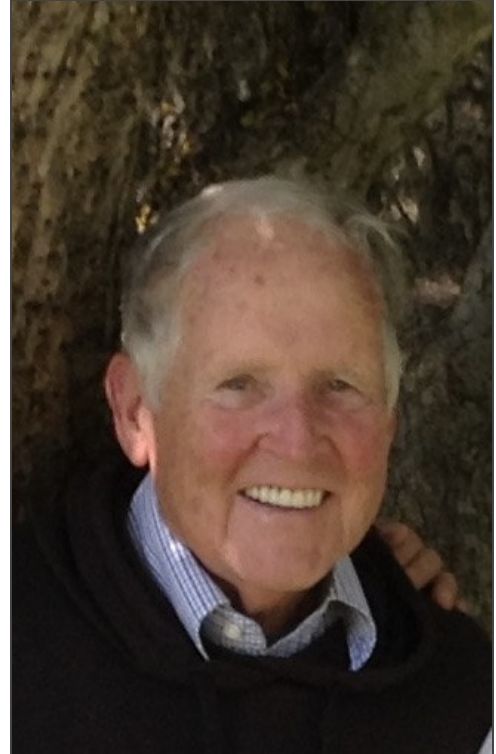
# Lorne Edward Ulveland
