

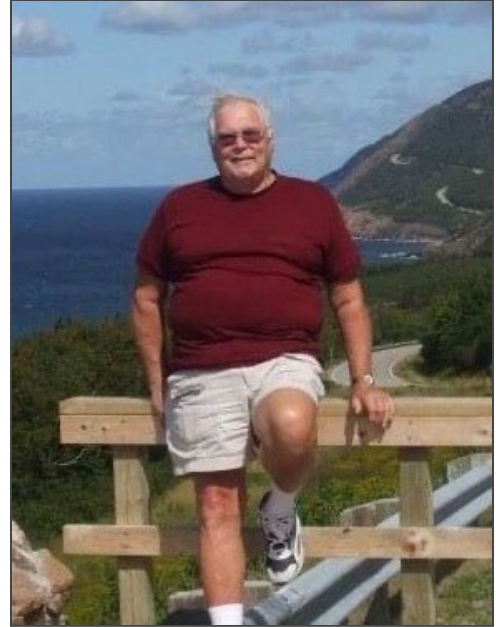
Doug Vokey

James Douglas (Doug) Vokey, age 79 years, late of Regina, SK and formally of St. John's, Newfoundland passed peacefully away at the Palliative Care Unit of the Pasqua Hospital in Regina, SK on April 25, 2021 after a lengthy illness.

Doug was born and raised in St. John's and grew up in the Rabbittown area of the city where he played baseball and was a member of the Church Lads Brigade. Upon graduating high school, Doug started working at A. Harvey and Company as an office clerk. He went on to work in the construction, offshore and logistics sectors mostly in leadership positions.
