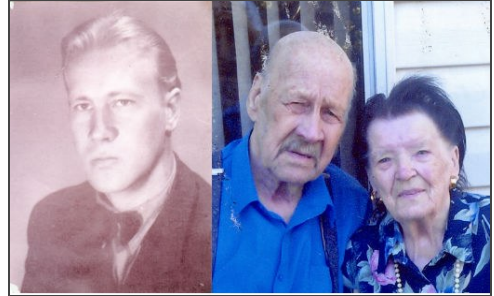


Evald Vollman
