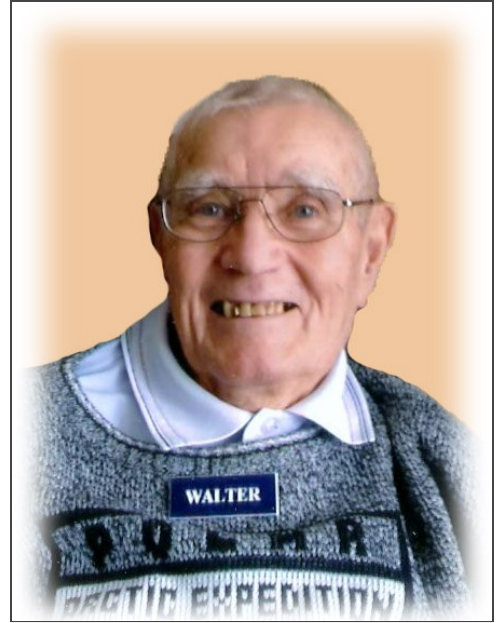


# Walter Wagner
