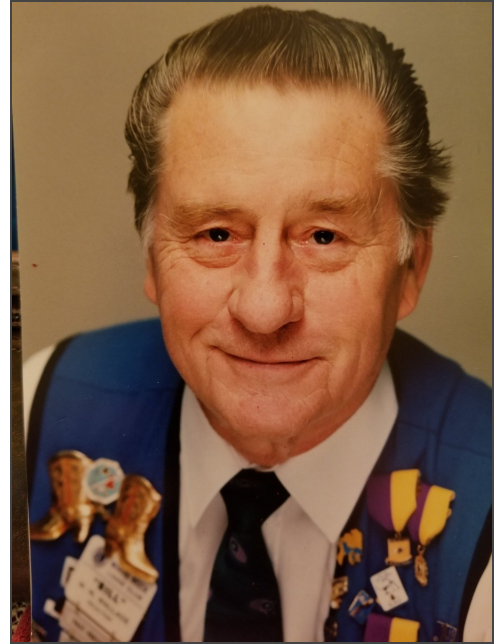


# William Wallace
