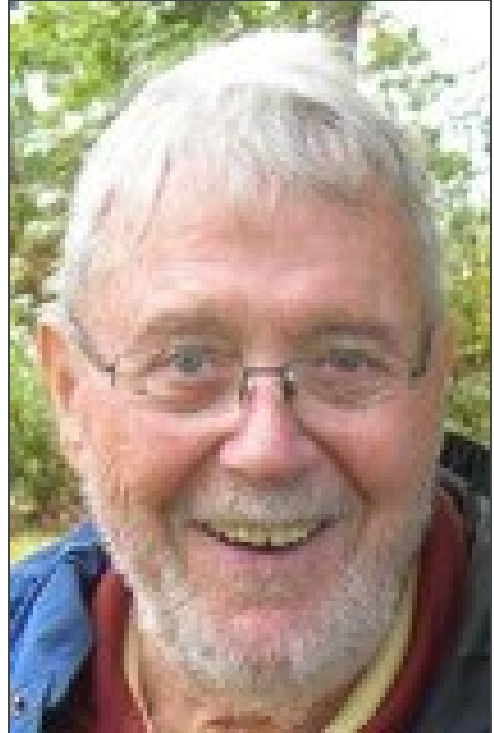


# Douglas Charles Watkins
