In the presence of family and tightly embraced by love, Winnie drew her last breath at 12:25 a.m. on Thursday, December 9, 2021. Winnie's final days and hours were spent with family by her side and under the compassionate care of medical professionals in the Regina Pasqua Hospital, Unit 4B and Palliative Care.

Winnie left for all to cherish her legacy of love, friendship, kindness, generosity, forgiveness, wit, humour, style, memories of an impeccable memory for detail and her "sparkling blue eyes".

Born in Manchester, England, Winnie's Canadian life began as a war bride immigrating to Canada in 1946. She arrived with her infant eldest son in Halifax, Nova Scotia on Saturday, September 21, 1946 aboard the Queen Mary.
