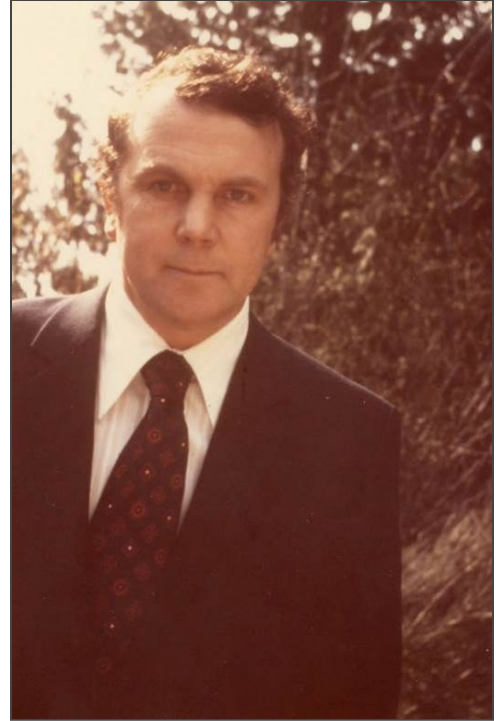


James Douglas White
