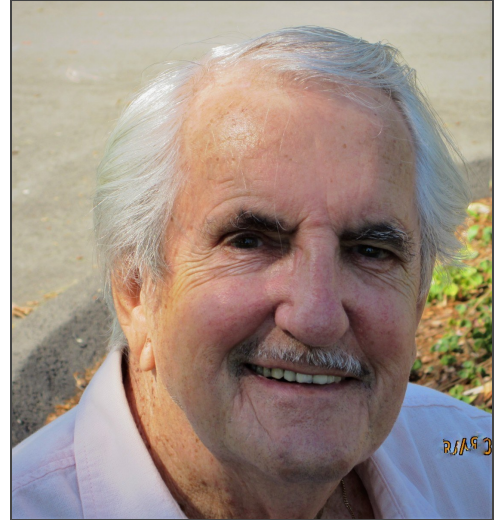


Raymond Tony Zazzara
